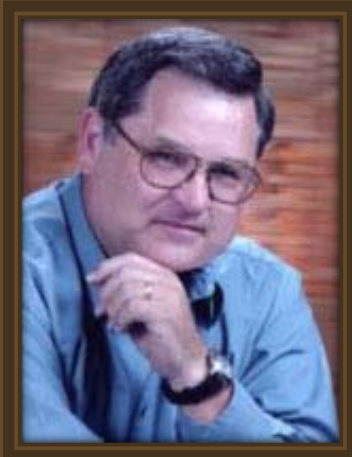

I have had a life-long passion for teaching - adult Sunday school, Deaf college students and married adults, local church teacher training, and seminary education at home and abroad. Over the last forty years, this passion has anchored itself in studies of Bible, theology, philosophy, and psychology and has expressed itself in local church education ministry, textbooks, courses, and conferences.

I was born in Clinton, Indiana and earned a Bachelor of Science degree (Psychology and Counseling) from the University of Maryland, Master of Religious Education and Doctor of Education degrees from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Educational Research from University of North Texas.

I am currently serving as Professor at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Texas, where I have taught since 1981. I have served two churches as minister with the deaf, and six churches as minister of education. Since 1996, I have traveled each year to republics of the former Soviet Union to share my passion for teaching with national pastors, educators, and missionaries.

I am a long-time member of the North American Professors of Christian Education (NAPCE) association, and was awarded the 2009 Distinguished Christian Educator award in our October meeting.

Here is a brief description of each element:

*"Go therefore and **make disciples** of all nations..." (Matt 28:19a)*

The Bible, God's Eternal Word.

God's Word is the Lamp that lights the way to growth in Christ.

The Needs of Learners.

"These are written . . . that you may have life in [Jesus'] name." (John 20:31). Jesus spoke to the needs of His learners.

Helping Learners Think.

Clear biblical thinking is essential to growth in Christ (Col 1:9-10).

Helping Learners Feel and Value appropriately.

Passionately embracing biblical attitudes and values is essential to growth in Christ (Romans 12:15).

Helping Learners Relate.

Building *koinonia* among learners is essential to growth in Christ (Matthew 22:37, 39).

Helping Learners Mature.

The goal of teaching is to help learners grow up into Christ-likeness (Ephesians 4:15).

Holy Spirit as Discippler.

The growth of learners has eternal and supernatural significance only when the Holy Spirit is engaged in the teaching process (John 16:13-14, Revelation 3:20).
